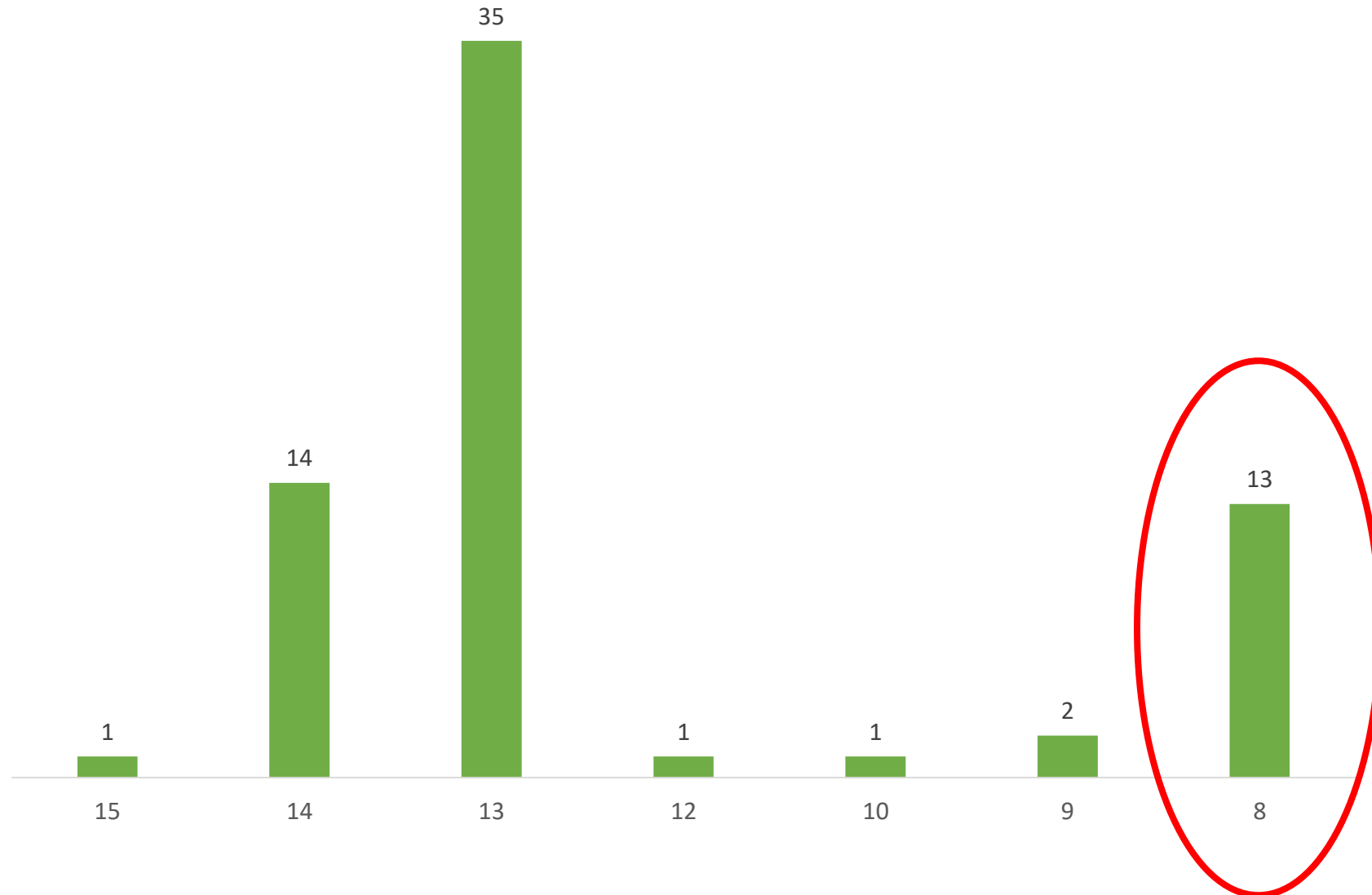

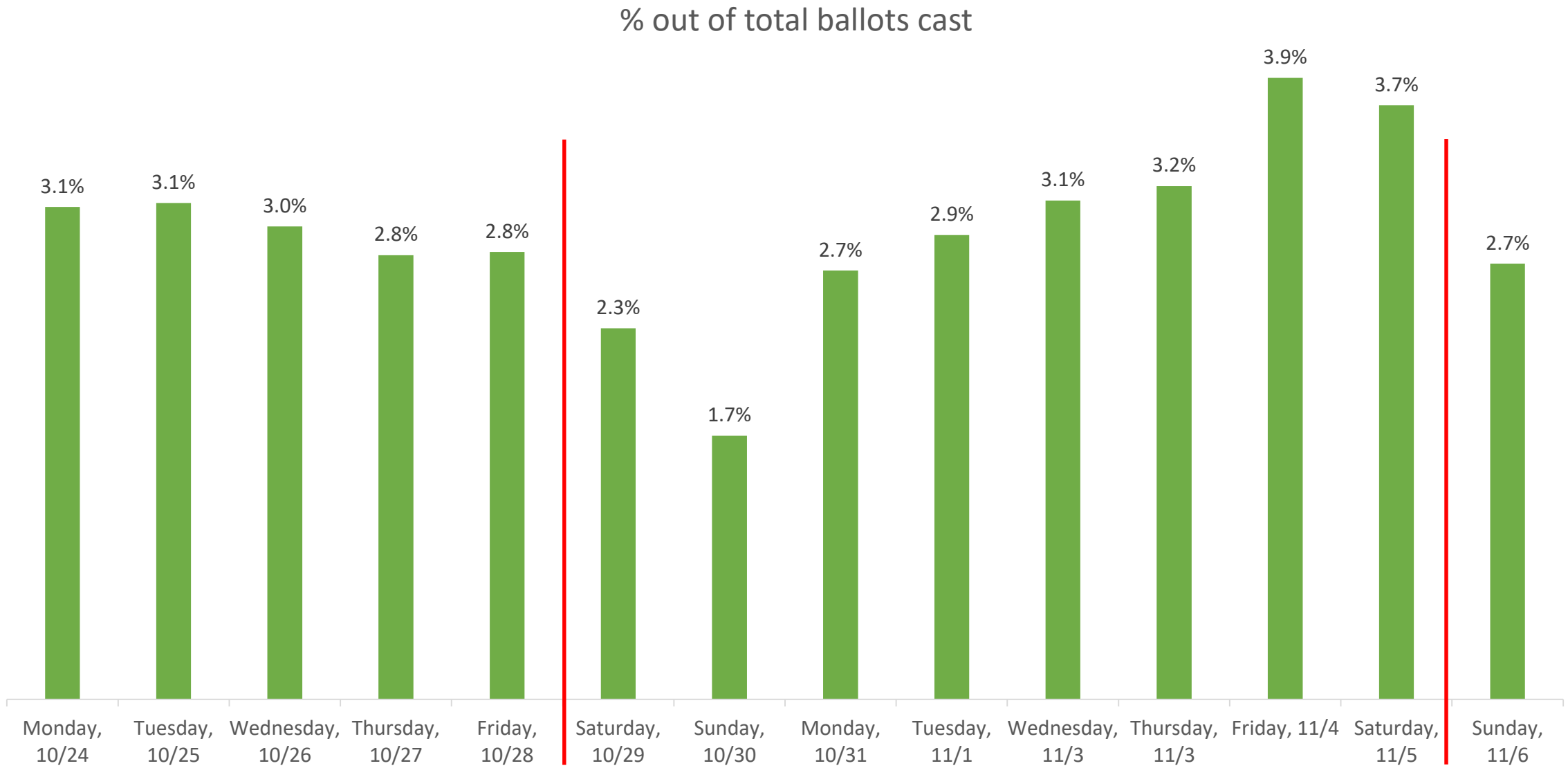
Overview

- Total turnout in Florida was 9,420,039 or 65.6% of eligible voters, up slightly from 8,538,264 or 63.3% of eligible voters in 2012
 - 41.2% of ballots were cast early (~28% in 2012)
 - 29% of ballots were cast by mail (~28% in 2012)
- 11 counties had more than 50% of their ballots cast early-in-person
 - Sumter, Baker, Madison, Duval, St. Johns, Hendry, Flagler, Broward, Clay, Nassau, and Bay
 - All but Hendry had turnout over 70%, and Sumter and Baker had total turnout over 80%
- One county - Pinellas - had more than 50% of ballots cast by mail (51.7%) and had the lowest percentage of ballots cast early
 - Total turnout was 75.9% of registered voters, up from 73.7% in 2012
- 18 counties had more than 70% of ballots cast **before** Election Day
 - Sumter, Miami-Dade, Lee, Charlotte, Osceola, Collier, Seminole, Orange, Broward, Martin, Flagler, Baker, Hillsborough, St. Johns, Nassau, Bay, Indian River, and Clay

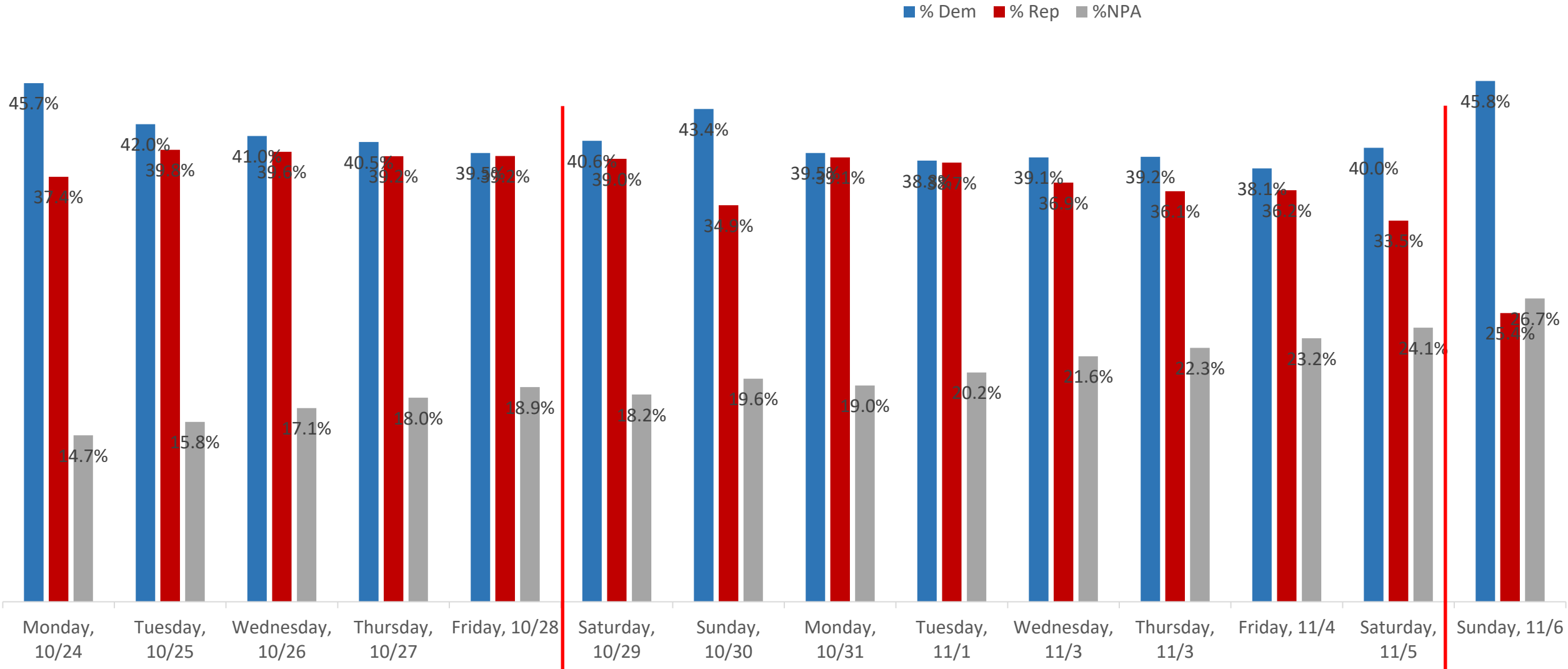
% out of total EV ballots cast



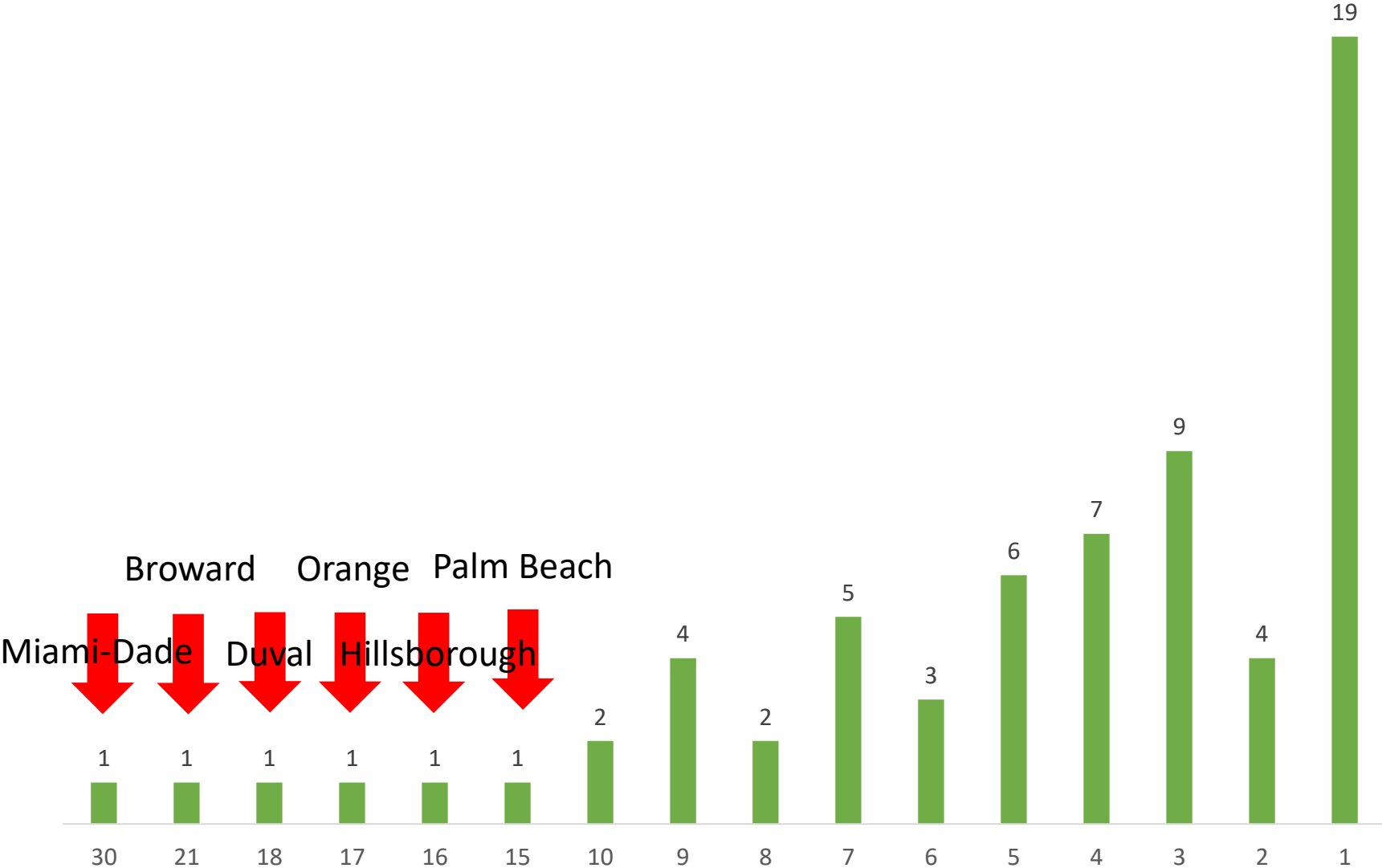
Early Voting By Day

- In 32 counties, the first day of early voting was the busiest
 - Franklin – 23.0% of early votes were cast on the first day
 - Gulf – 21.6% of early votes were cast on the first day
- In 22 counties, the last day of early voting was the busiest
 - Pinellas – 14.4% of early votes were cast on the last day
 - Manatee – 13.0% of early votes were cast on the last day

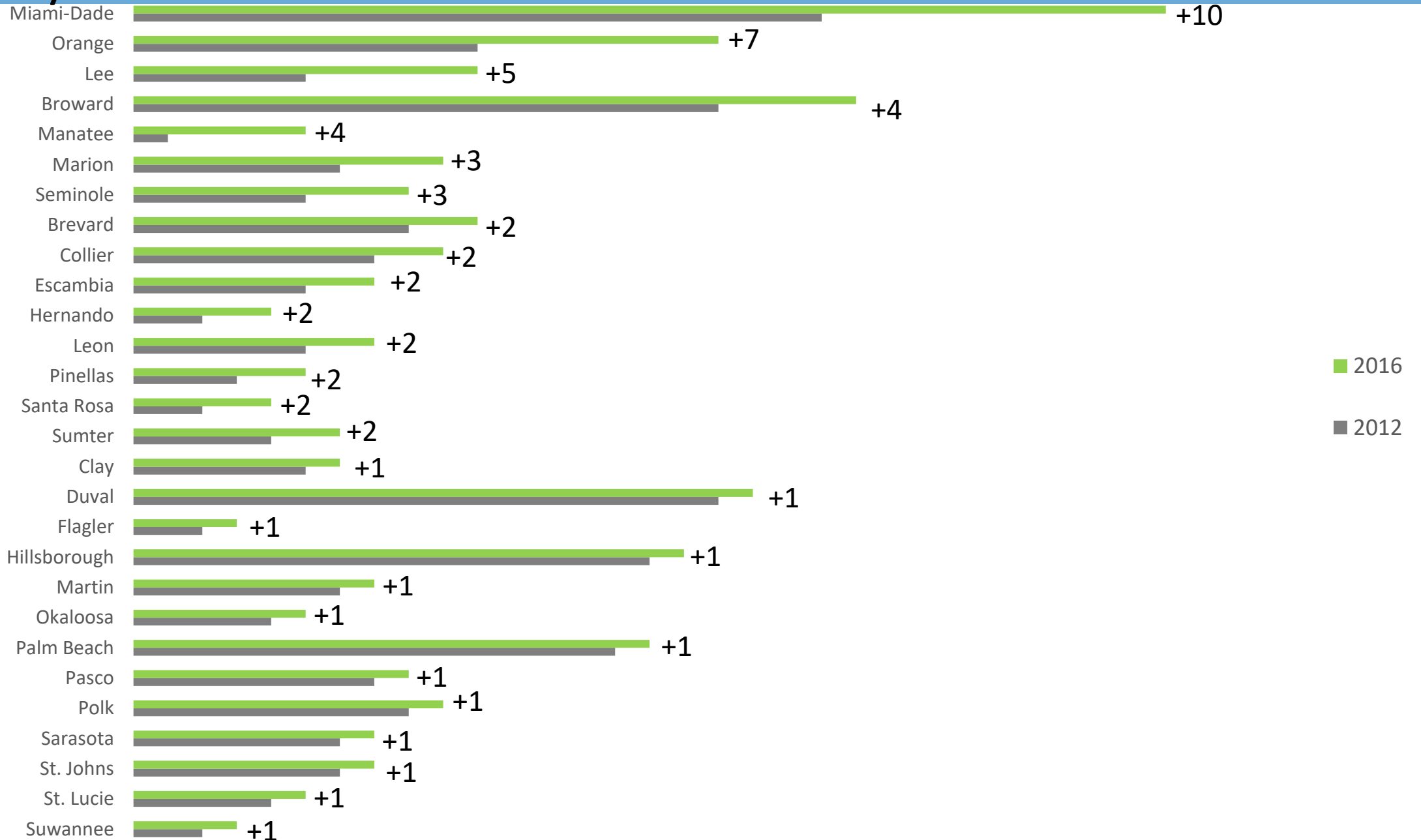
Early Voting By Party By Day
