



Vacant House seats must be filled by election. For the Senate, sta governors may fill vacancies.

Representatives choose their presiding ordiner, the Speaker, from among the members hip of the majority party. Other elected officers, such as the chaptain, clerk of the House, sergeard at arms, and dookeeper, are not members of the House. Impeachment is the power to remove dear all officers. The House inditables the ploces by voting to impeach, which then refers the matter to the Senate for a finial.
