Dear Ms. Carrier,

As President of the Florida State Association of Supervisors of Elections (FSE), I am writing you on behalf of all Florida Supervisors of Elections in response to the recent Voter Participation Center (VPC) and the Center for Voter Information (CVI) campaign.

We appreciate your cooperation to provide Supervisors with advance notice of your mass mailing in September. However, based on our experience, the association still has reservations and concerns about the campaign. These ongoing misleading and inaccurate mailings from the VPC and CVI continue to erode voter confidence and increase suspicion, mistrust, and anger among Florida voters.

In your notification to Florida Supervisors of Elections of your pending campaign, you state, "The registration mailings will go to unregistered young people who will be eligible to vote in the upcoming elections for the first time, to voters who have recently moved and have not re-registered or updated their voter registration records (according to the latest available information), and others who are unregistered in the voting age population."

In 2019, Governor DeSantis announced Florida's membership to the Electronic Registration Information Center (ERIC), a multi-state partnership to improve the accuracy of America's voter rolls and increase access to voter registration for all eligible citizens. ERIC allows states to maintain accurate voter rolls by comparing voter registration data with other member states and the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV), Social Security Administration (SSA), and the Postal Service's National Change of Address (NCOA) registry.

In addition to enhancing the accuracy of voter rolls, ERIC also improves voter registration by providing information for member states to contact potentially eligible but unregistered voters with instructions on how to register to vote.

The mailings of VPC and CVI are counterproductive and place an unnecessary burden on the elections' office staff to defend our positions and regain voter trust, amid actively preparing for upcoming elections. We will continue to strongly urge voters who are upset or have concerns over the mailings to contact you.
